Library & Equipment Committee Report

At last the Guild's library and equipment has been moved from storage to the Guild Hall! Thanks to the efforts to many guild members and special thanks to Jen, Michael, Fred and Vaughan for moving the book cart – again!

Everything will be cataloged in more detail soon. Members may contact Sarah or Gina to check out or renew equipment or books.

The Library & Equipment Committee has made some changes to SHG's equipment policy and recommendations about what things to keep and which to sell or give away. Basically, if members see items that they will use, we can keep them. Most items that are "not to keep" are ones that have not been checked out in a number of years. Some items are old and not in very good shape.

We suggest keeping the things we use for workshops and classes or for members' personal use. We are not keeping items that "might" be heirlooms or of sentimental value.

Items will be loaned to SHG members, or rented to students in SHG classes, for 30 days. Members may renew items each month as long as no one else needs them. Looms rented for classes may be kept for the duration of the class. A deposit may be required for equipment so that it is returned promptly and in good condition.

All potential donations will be considered by the Library and Equipment Committee. To be accepted, items must be useful and in good working order.

For Your Future File: SHG Will Host Tartan Weaving Class

Linda Davis, a nationally known weaving instrutor from Oregon, will teach a 2.5-day workshop called *Connect with Your Heritage: Weave a Tartan* on April 17, 18 and 19 at the Guild Hall.

The workshop covers tartan lore and history, tips and tricks for weaving tartans, resources for selecting and designing tartans, and finishing techniques.

Students can choose to weave a scarf, towel or runner using a tartan pattern selected prior to the workshop. Linda will provide warping instructions for the tartans so that pre-warped looms can be brough to class.
