Next meeting is **Tuesday, March 10, at 6:00 PM** in our Guild Hall at 606 W. Garland in Spokane.

Diana Taylor, certified *Weaving a Life* leader, will give a presentation. *Weaving a Life*, created by Susan Barrett Merrill, is a mindful weaving program using simple Keyforms, as a pathway for personal growth and development. Woven on simple frame looms, the Keyforms share the weaver's personal story, in an intimate and meaningful way.

Diana Taylor is a 27-year veteran of child and adolescent psychiatric nursing, now working with adults dealing with addictions and homelessness. She finds that using weaving as a therapeutic tool is an exciting way to connect with others and make a difference.

Following the presentation, enjoy show-and-tell of recent projects and finger foods and beverages brought to share.

Register Now For Workshops Offered in March

BEGINNING WEAVING CLASS - March 21 & 22

SHG member Colleen East will teach a two-day class for beginning weavers. No prior weaving experience required. This workshop how to set up a loom and weave basic plain weave and twills. Students will learn how a harness loom works and how to read weaving drafts and patterns. A four-harness loom is required for this class. The Guild has several for rent on a first-come basis.

Workshop price is \$195.00; Loom rental is \$35.00.

WEAVING A BUSINESS: Selling Your Handmade Textiles - March 24

This workshop, presented by Kristie Sherrodd at the Guild Hall, is designed to provide weavers and other textile artisans with information and basic business skills needed to take their products into the market-place. This workshop is intended to help artisans sell their work in any venues, but specifically to prepare for the Guild's first self-hosted three-day sale scheduled for November 6, 7 & 8, 2015 at the Guild Hall.



The Guild is offering two weaving exchanges for members to participate in! For each challenge, participants are asked to weave a number of kitchen towels. Towels are due Fall 2015.

Beginning Weavers' Challenge

- Use 2 or 4 harnesses
- Structure = plain weave or twill
- Woven size 18" x 30" before finishing
- Number of towels to weave = 3
- (1 for you to keep, 1 as a donation to the Guild sale, 1 to exchange)
- Include complete draft with each towel
- Yarn suggestions: 3/2, 5/2, 8/2, 8/4, Sugar & Cream
- Skill focus: Even selvedges with little drawn-in, no threading or treadling errors, hemming and wet finishing
- Bonus challenge: interesting use of color or texture or accent

Advanced Weavers' Challenge

- Structure must require four or more harnesses
- Structure = weaver's choice
- Finished and hemmed size 18" x 30"
- Number of towels to weave = 6
- (1 for you to keep, 1 as a donation to the Guild sale, 4 to exchange)
- Include complete draft with each towel
- Yarn suggestions: 5/2, 8/2, 10/2, 20/2 nothing heavier than 5/2 except as an accent
- Skill focus: Even selvedges with little drawn-in, no threading or treadling errors, hemming and wet finishing PLUS appropriate structure for intended use (float length, density, drape)
- Bonus challenges: Original draft, six different treadlings on one threading

Surplus Equipment Sale Was a Big Success

Thank you SHG members who participated in the guild's equipment sale! We made over \$500 and "rehomed" some surplus weaving equipment supplies.

The Guild library and equipment committee has been working since last June, moving and repairing the guild's books and equipment. In June we moved the library books and cart from Orchard Crest, and the Guild's looms from a storage unit in Spokane Valley, over to the south hill, with help from many guild members and friends.

Then in November, everything was moved again to the new Guild Hall in the Garland District.

All this time, the committee was evaluating the materials and making decisions about the storage and maintenance of the equipment. It was determined that since there is limited space for storage, some of the equipment would be offered for sale to guild members. We kept those looms and tools that are in good repair and can be used in workshops and classes.

Thanks, again, to members who helped with all the moving and arranging, and who bought some of the surplus equipment. With the \$500, we have a start on a "kitty" for purchase of new weaving tools.
